Community Dinner

Five years ago, St. Benedict's Church began providing once a week dinner to anyone needing/wanting a meal. Those dinners were served to-go during the pandemic as we followed the distancing rules and closed our indoor dining until the beginning of this year when the Community Center once again created a dining room space with tables and chairs and encouraged people sit together to enjoy their meal with fellow diners.

Los Osos Cares has taken over coordinating the weekly meals and providing menu ingredients when needed. The prepared food is provided by several of the service organizations and churches in Los Osos...each taking a turn to do so.

What started as providing a meal for a small group of under 20 people has evolved to serving over 100 meals each week. We hope to continue providing meals to whomever needs/wants a free meal as part of our church's community wide outreach.

SENIOR PROGRAM

Los Osos Cares connects seniors to community resources. Older adults are provided with resources and community contacts to help older adults living in Los Osos. The Senior Program plans and coordinates presentations to groups about the concerns of older adults. Some volunteers have specialized skills working with older adults. A service list is available for all services and organizations in SLO County. Morro Bay Resource Connection is an agency that provides mutual resources. County agencies bring services to the Resource Center. Is a member of the Commission on Aging and the Adult Services Policy Council of San Luis Obispo.

"Estero Bay R U OK" senior phone helpline launched

with three team members and separate phone lines to serve Los Osos, Morro Bay, and Cayucos. This was created to establish a direct phone line for seniors to receive information and referral services, connection to Resource centers, and emergency funding. We will add wellness calls for those who wish to receive them. The idea was to have a local team member with knowledge of the community to help those in need. Team members are Los Osos Violeta Vallin, Morro Bay Sharon O'Leary, Cayucos Robyn Taylor.

COMMUNITY COALITION PROGRAM

The Community Coalition is composed of representatives from service organizations, faithbased community groups, SLO Coastal Unified School District, local law enforcement, local government, and the Chamber of Commerce. Bi-monthly meetings are held at the South Bay Community Center. Meeting topics reflect the needs of the community, such as poverty, health, the unhoused, resources, affordable activities for youth and older adults and transportation.

RESOURCE CENTER PROGRAM

The Resource Center is now open Tuesday - Wednesday - Thursday 1pm - 3pm.
